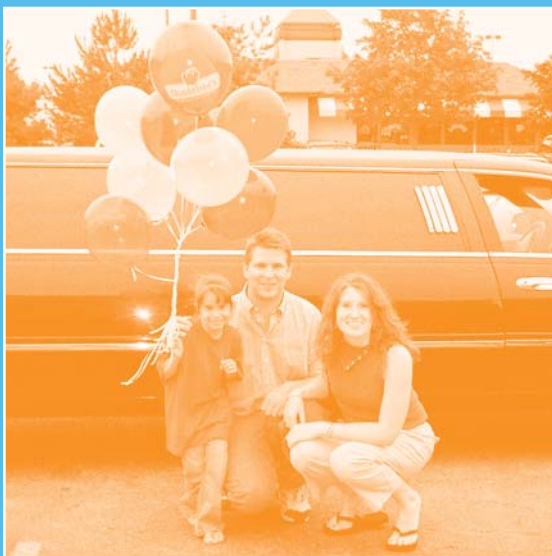

Getting Started

Candidates are asked to complete a volunteer application. Simply call the Make-A-Wish® office at 800-236-WISH or 262-781-4445 or visit us online at wisconsin.wish.org for an application.

After we receive a completed application, background and reference checks are performed. Once these checks are cleared, a staff member will contact you by mail and invite you to a volunteer orientation.

There are many ways you can help make wishes come true for Wisconsin children including the following volunteer opportunities:

Wish Granter

Wish granters act as liaisons between the wish children and the Make-A-Wish office. The wish granter meets with the wish child and his or her family to plan a truly magical and unique wish. Special volunteer training is needed to become a wish granter.

Special Event Volunteer
